EXPLANATION Of ALL the PLATES In the THIRD VOLUME.

Greenwich Hospital in Perspective, p. 3, and 4.

Have faid fo much of this noble Stru-fure in my Firft Volume, that I fhall add nothing at prefent, but to affure the Readers, that the Perfpective is raided from the Geometrical Pleasant

raifed from the Geometrical Plan and Elevation according to the most exact Rules of that lineary Art.

Cafile Howard in Perspective, p. 5, and 6.

THIS Seat being alfo fo fully defcribed in the First Volume, I thought nothing could be further wanting to give a perfect Idea of the Place, but an accurate View of the fame in Perspective.

Ambresbury, p. 7.

Is the Seat of the Right Honourable the Lord Conteton, in Willfaire. This Houfe was defigned by Jaigo Toner, and executed by Mr. Webb. Here is a bold ruftick Bafement, which fupports a regu-lar Loggio of the Composed Order. In one Plate I have given the Plans of the Firft and Second Story, with the principal Front. The great Stair-cafe is remarkable here for having a little one in the Middle of it. Anno 1661.

Caftle Ashby, p. 8.

IN Northamptonflire, the Seat of the Right Ho-nourable the Earl of Northampton. The greateft Part of the Caftle is very antient; but in the Reign of King Charles I. Jugo Jones was imployed to rebuild it, and finish one Front; but the Civil Wars put a Stop to all Arts, 1642, when that va-liant Earl was fain at Salt Heath near Stefford. In this Plate I have allo given Two Plans, and ther this Plate I have alfo given Two Plans, and that Front by Inigo Jones.

Stoke Park, p. 9.

THE Seat of Mr. Arundel in Northamptonfbire. This Building was begun by Inizo Jones; the Wings, and Collonades, and all the Foundations, were made by him; but the Front of the Houfe was defigned by another Architect, the Civil Wars having alfo interrupted this Work. In one Plate I have given both a general Plan and Front 1640.

General Wade's House, p. 10.

I N great Burlington-Street, London. This beauti-ful Defign is the Invention of the Right Honourful Defign is the Invention of the Kight Honour-able the Earl of Barlington, who is not only a great Patron of all Arts, but the first Architect. His Lordship's learned Labours in this Art, which are now preparing for the Publick, will give a much juster Idea of his confummate Knowledge in Ar-chitecture, than any thing I am capable to fay. In one Plate you have Two Plans, and the princi-real Wonn 1724. pal Front 1724.

Grimsthorpe, p. 11, 12, 13, and 14.

N Lincolnfbire, the Seat of his Grace the Duke of Ancaster and Kesteven. Of this I have made Four Plates, the First is the Plan of the First or Four relates, the First is the Plan of the First or principal Story, where all the Apartments are ex-actly figured. In the Second Plate you have the Front to the Court; in the Third, the Garden Front, adorned with a magnificent Corinthan Por-tico; and in the Fourth, you have the Weft Front the Eaft Front being the fame. All defigned by Sir Table Wester the Court of the Second Sir John Vanbrugh, Anno 1724.

Eaftbury, p. 15, 16, 17, 18, 19.

N Dorfeisbire, the Seat of the Right Honourable I M Dorfelipine, the Seat of the Right Honourable George Daddington, E(quire, in Five Plates. The First contains an exact Plan of the Gardens, de-figned and finished by the ingenious Mr. Charles Bridgeman. In the Second, you have the general Plan of the House and Out-Offices, with a Table of References. In the Third Plate, an Elevation of the minist Wine with a militared Demine of of the principal Front, with a rufficated Portico of the Dorick Order. In the Fourth, the Plan and Elevation of the great Portico, placed at the End of the Garden facing the Houfe. The Portico is *Corinhian Hexafile*. The Columns 3 Feet Dia-meter, the molf magnificent of its Kind in *England*. The Fifth contains the Plan and Elevation of the *Barnia* in the Garden treasting the *Barnia* for *Caru*. Bognio in the Garden, fronting the Bowling Green. All defigned and executed by Sir John Vanbrugh, Anno 1718.

Seaton Delaval, p. 20, 21.

IN Northumberland, the Seat of Francis Delaval, Efquire, in Two Plates. In the Firft, I have given the general Plan of the Houfe and Out Of-fices, with the North Front of the Houfe to a larger Scale. In the Second, you have the South Front, where is a noble Portion of the Ionick Order Tetra-dile the Columns a Heat Disprese. All defound ftile, the Columns 3 Feet Diameter. All defigned and executed by Sir John Vanbrugh, Anno 1720.

Burlington Houfe in Piccadilly, London, p. 22, 23, 24, 25, 26.

THE following Defigns of my Invention are contained in Two fingle, and one double Plate. In the First you have the general Plan of the Houfe and Offices; the Stables were built by another Architech before I had the Honour of being called The Bront of the Houfe, the Conjunction from The Front of the Holle, the Conjunction from thence to the Offices, the great Gate and Street Wall, were all defigned and executed by me. In the double Plate you have the principal Front, where a bold ruffick Bafement fupports a regular *Ionick* Collonade of 2 Columns 2 Feet Diameter. The Line is clofed with Two Towers, adored with Two Versite Windows is Deserved at Conwith Two Venetian Windows in Front, and Two Niches

noble Patron has prepar'd the Statues of Palladio and Jones, in Honour to an Art of which he is the Support and Ornament. In the next Plate you have the great Gate, adorned with 4 1 Columns of the Dorick Order, 2 Feet Diameter, agreeable to the Colonade in the Court. In the laft I have given the Plan and Elevation of the Cafina at Chifwick, which is the First Effay of his Lordsbip's happy Invention, Anno 1717.

Houghton from p. 27, to p. 34, inclusive,

IN Norfolk, the Seat of the Right Honourable Robert Walpole, Efquire, Chancellor of the Exchequer, and first Commissioner of his Majesty's Treafury, of which I have made Two double, and Four fingle, Plates. In the First you have a Plan of the Gardens and Plantations, which are very large and beautiful. In the Subfequent are all the Defigns of my Invention; First, the general Plan and Front of the House and Offices, extending 450 Feet. The First fingle Plate contains the Plans of the principal and Attick Story: The great Hall is a Cube of 40 Feet, the Salon 40 by 30 Feet, and 30 Feet high, and all the other Rooms in the Four great Apartments, are 18 Feet high, the Attick Story 12 Feet, and the Ruftick Story the fame, all above Ground, under which is an intire Story of Cellars, all arched. In the Second Plate I have given the Front to the great Entrance, extending 166 Feet, lying open to the Park. The Basement is ruftick, and I have also rufticated the Windows and Door-Cafe in the principal Story; the Building is finished with Two Towers, drefs'd with Two ruftick Venetian Windows. In the next Plate is the Front to the Garden, with a regular Portico Tetrafills lower, the Columns 3 Feet 1 Diameter. In this Front the Windows of the principal Story are drefs'd without Rufficks. The laft Plate is the Section of the great Hall, all in Stone, the moft beautiful in England ; the whole Building is Stone, and, without pretending to excuse any feeming, or real Defects, I believe, it will be allowed to be a Houfe of State and Conveniency, and, in fome Degree, worthy of the great and generous Patron. Anno 1722.

Mereworth Caftle, p. 35, 36, 37, 38.

IN Kent, the Seat of the Honourable John Fane, Efquire, contained in One double, and Two fingle, Plates. In the double Plate you have Three Plans of the Ground Story, the principal and Attick: The Ground Story extends 220 by 120 Feet, all arched, and 12 Feet high. In the Middle is a circular Veftibule 34 Feet Diameter, turned with one bold Arch, illuminated by Two Windows at each End of the Traverse Pailage, and by Night one Lanthorn, fufpended from the Key Stone of this great Arch, lights into Twenty diffinct Rooms. The Afcent is 12 Feet high to the principal Story, being, by Two Flights of Steps, 42 Feet broad the Square of the Houfe is 88 Feet; but including the Four Porticoes 120 Feet. As the Rooms of this Story are of various Extents, fo is the Height: The Two Rooms in Front being 35 Feet by 20 Feet, and the great Gallery in the opposite Front 82 Feet by 20 Feet, are 22 Feet high, and coved 3: The Side Rooms, confisting of Two Bed Cham-bers 22 Feet by 20 Feet, and Two dreffing Rooms 14 Feet by 20 Feet, are only 15 Feet high, not coved; fo that the Entablature of all these Rooms is of the fame Height. Over the Rooms not coved, and under the Attick Story, are Mezonias for Servants, and other Conveniencies: The Circular Salon in the Center is 35 Feet Diameter, and . 60 Feet high, receiving Light by Four large circular Windows in the Dome, which is finished in

Niches in Flank, fronting each other, where the Stucco, with Compartments much after the Manner of the Ritonda. The Ornaments are executed by Signor Bagutti, a most ingenious Artist. The Afcent to the Attick Story is by Two circular Stair-Cafes, landing in a Poggio, round the great Salon, which leads into all the Apartments of this Floor, which leads into all the Apartments of this root, being 12 Feet high, and the Plan will fufficiently deforibe the reft. The Firif fingle Plate con-tains the North Front: The Four Portions are all the fame, being Hexaftile, Euffile: The Column Ionité 2 Feet 4 Diameter; a juft Entablature fur-rounds the whole Building, with the proper Mem-bers inriched. In the laft Plate is the Section from North to Seath extending 220 Fere. I final not North to South, extending 220 Feet. I fhall not pretend to fay, That I have made any Improve-ments in this Plan from that of *Palladio*, for *Signor Almerico*; but fhall only obferve the Alterations, which I humbly fubmit to my learned Judges : The new Plan is much enlarged, and the Ground Story intirely different. In Palladio the Vestibule is supported by Four Pires in the Middle, without any Light. In the principal Story are Four large, and Four fmall, Rooms, but no Gallery, nor large Bed-Chambers : The Four Porticoes are flanked with a Wall, which are intirely open in this. In the Firft the Stair Cafes are Triangular, which puts the Doors at unequal Diftances. In this the Stair-Cafes, being circular, brings the Doors to anfwer the Two diagonal Lines. In the Firft there are but Four Chimneys, which are brought up by Four Obelisks on the Outfide Walls. The Dome is a Semi-circular Octogon covered with Red Pantiles, fupported by Carpentry. The Columns in the Porticoes are Brick-work covered with Stucco. The Entablature of Wood, and all the other Ornaments are in Stucco. This Dome confifts of Three Shells : The First is Carpentry with Stucco, which forms the Cieling of the Salon. The Outward is alfo Carpe Atry, covered with Lead, but of a particular Contourn: Between these Two Shells, there is a ftrong Brick Arch, that brings 24 Funnels to the Lanthorn, which is finished with a Copper Callot, without any Injury to the Smoke, which was not the least difficult Part of the Defign. And, if I may add the great Difference, both of Drefs and Materials, the whole ornamental Parts being of Portland Stone; and as much inriched, as the Rules of our Art can admit. And here I am, in Juffice, to acknowledge the Faults as only chargeable to me; for never Architect had a more beneficent and liberal Patron, where neither Ignorance, Caprice, or Covetoufnefs, had any Part. Here nothing was wanting for Strength, Conveniency, or Ornament. Under fuch uncommon Encouragement, I have used my utmost Endeavours; but, Humanum est labi; It is the best House that has fewest Faults: And if it gives Satisfaction to the Honourable and Worthy Owner, I have my End. This Houfe was covered in Anno 1723.

Wanftead, p. 39, 40.

IN Effex, the Seat of the Right Honourable the Lord Vifcount Caftlemain. I have given the Plan, Elevation, and Section, of this great Houfe in my first Volume, which I shall not refume here, but only give the Front with the Addition of the new Towers, which I defigned. Anno 1720.

Stourhead Caflle, p. 41, 42, 43. N Willifbire, the Seat of Henry Hoare, Elquire, in Three fingle Plates. In the firlt I have given the Original Plan, as defigned by me, and as altered in the Execution. The Difference lies in changing the Portico into 4 & Columns, transposing Two back Stair-Cafes, and contracting one Front Room, and Two Side Rooms. The Second Plate gives the Front to the Court, extending 82 Feet, the ruffick

ruftick Basement supports à regular Tetrastile, Euftile, of the Composed Order, the Columns 2 Feet 1 Diameter, with a just Entablature and Ballustrade round the whole Edifice. This Front gives a very beautiful and extensive raise rules gives a Very beautiful and extensive Profpect over the rich Vale of *Dorfelbirs*, *Eaft* and *South*, and is protected from the *North* by high Mountains, covered with Downs. The laft is the Garden Front *South*, extending 92 Feet, where the Windows of the principal Story are rufticated, as well as the Bafement. The whole Building is cafed with Stone, and was covered in Anno 1722.

The Rolls, p. 44, 45.

I N Chancery Lane, I built by a Royal Gift from our moft gracious Sovereign King GEORGE, to Sir Sjoeph Jekyll, prefent Mafter of the Rolls. The First Plate gives the Plans of the First and Second rint rate gives the rians of the rint and Second Stories, extending So by 60 Feet. The great Caufe Room is 42 by 30 Feet, including the Colo-nade, and 28 Feet high. The Second Plate gives the Front to the Court. All the Ornaments are of *Portland* Stone, and was built Anno 1718.

Newby, p. 46.

IN the North-Riding of Torkfbre, the Seat of Sir William Robinfor, Baronet, in a chearful and healthy Situation. At the Diffance of 100 Yards, the Swale forms a perpetual Cafcade 150 Feet broad, abounding in excellent Salmon, and all Sorts of River Fish. Of this Defign of my Invention, I have made one fingle Plate, containing the Plans of the First and Second Stories in a Square of 76 Feet. The Salon is a Cube of 30 Feet. The First Story is 15 Feet high, and the Attick 12 Feet. The Front is adorned with a Tetrastile, Eustile, Inick & Columns 3 Feet Diameter, with a regular Entablature and Balluftrade round the Building, which is all Stone. There are also Two large Wings for Offices, joined to the House by an Arcade, and was covered Anno 1721.

Ebberton Lodge, 47.

I N Torksbire, near Scarborough, belonging to Wil-liam Thompson, Efquire, about Three Miles from his principal Seat. This fmall rustick Edifrom his principal Seat. This fmall ruftick Edi-fice ftands in a fine Park well planted, with a River, which forms a Cafcade and Canal 1200 Feet long, and runs under the Loggio in the back Front.

Lord Herbert's Houfe in Whitehall, p. 48.

N one fingle Plate I have given the Plans of the Principal and Attick Stories, with the Front next to the Banquetting Houfe. In the Bafement is a ruftick Arcade, and over it, an *Ionick* Loggio and Attick. The Gallery of the laft Story is most magnificently finished, and gives one of the best Profpefts of the Thames. Anno 1724.

Hall-Barn, p. 49, 50.

N EAR Beconsfield, in Bucks, the Seat of Edmond Waller, Elquire, a Place for ever famous, by the Deathlefs Poems of the great Waller, Grandfather to this learned and worthy Gentleman. This new Building, of my Invention, ftands fronting a great Canal 200 Feet broad, and 1200 Feet long, leaving a Terras of 50 Feet between them: In Two fingle Plates. The Firft gives the Plan and Elevation of the Whole. The great Room is 30 Elevation of the Whole. The great Room is 30 Feet in Front, 30 Feet high, 45 Feet in Depth, coved 4. The Side Rooms are Cubes of 12 Feet, with a Clofet to each. In the Second Plate is the Section of the great Room, expressing the Manner of finishing, and Form of the Ceiling. The Two Niches are to be filled with the Statues of Homer and Virgil : The Circles over them, with the Buftos

of Milton and Addison, and Mr. Waller over the Chimney-Piece. I believe it will be no eafy Matter to make out fuch another Quinquevirate. This Building was begun and covered in Anno 1724.

Goodwood, p. 51, 52, 53, 54.

I N Suffex, the Seat of his Grace the Duke of Richmond and Lenox, Three Miles from Chichefter, in the most agreeable Part of the County. I have made One double, and Two fingle Plates. The first contains a Plan of the Park, Gardens, and Plantations, which, for the beautiful Variety and Extension of Prospect, spacious Lawns, Sweetnefs of Herbage, delicate Venison, excellent Fruit, thriving Plantations, lofty and awful Trees, is inferior to none. The great Improvements Mr. Carné has made in this delightful Place, will be lafting Monuments of his Art and Industry, and Carne? Oaks shall never be forgot. This Park has an eafy Defcent to the *Eaft*, South, and South-weft, with the Prospect of a rich and beautiful Landskip, bounded by the Sea for 30 Miles in Sight. The Ifle of Wight terminates the South-west Prospect, and the famous St. Rook's Hill covers it from the North: I have given the following Defigns of my Invention in Two fingle Plates. In the First the general Plan of the principal Story and general Front, extending 305 Feet: The Body of the Houle 125 by 105 Feet: The circular Salon is 40 Feet in Diameter, and 60 Feet high, illuminated by a vertical Light 10 Feet in Diameter. The Room next the Portico is 40 by 24 Feet: The Two Side Rooms 36 by 24 Feet: All 24 Feet high, and coved 4. The Bed Chambers are 24 Feet fquare, belides the Alcoves for the Beds: The Dreffing Rooms 24 by 18 Feet: The Cabinets 24 by 16 Feet: The Antichambers 24 Feet square: The Vestibule 32 by 24 Feet, in a Gradation of various Proportions, and all thefe are only 16 Feet high, without any Coving, with Mezonins between them and the Attick Sto-The Two circular Stair-Cafes are 12 Feet in Diameter, and land in a Poggio round the Salon. that ferves all the Apartments above, which are 15 Feet high, and coved 4. The Two Pavilions are 75 by 50 Feet, the Firft Story is 12 Feet, and the Second is 10 Feet, high, excepting the Kitchin, which takes in both. Thefe Pavilions are laid out in convenient Offices, and are joined to the Houfe by Two Colonades of the Dorick Order, with inclofed Paffages behind them. In the laft Plate is the Weft Front, adorned with an Ionick Portico, Hexastile, Eustile. The Columns are 2 Feet 1 in Diameter. All the Ornaments are of Portland Stone, and the reft of Brick-work, covered with Stucco. The fhining Qualities, and fingular En-dowments, of this illuftrious Peer, is too great a Subject for me to attempt, when the most skilful Panegyrift will find it too much. I fhall only labour, with the utmost Zeal, as an Architect, to do fomething not unworthy fo good, fo great, and for generous a Patron.

Mr. Plumptre's Houfe, p. 55.

N Nottingham Town. In One fingle Plate I have given the Plan of the First Story and Elevation, extending 80 Feet. The Basement is 5 Feet above Ground, which gives Light to the Offices. The Windows in the First Story are rufticated : In the Second they are drefs'd with Pediments, and a circular Window in the Middle. The Attick Windows are fquare, and the whole is finished with a regular Cornice and Ballustrade. All the Ornaments are of very good Stone, and the reft of Brickwork, covered with Stucco. The back Part of this Houfe is antient. The Front gives a Profpect of the Trent : But the Humanity, and Generofity

A new Defign for a Bridge at Lambeth. p. 56.

HE Honourable House of Commons having named a Committee to receive Plans and Propofals for fo ufeful a Project, the Right Honourable William Poultney was chofe Chairman, who was pleafed to command me to prepare a Defign, with the Approbation of the Earl of Burlington. His Lordship was not only pleafed to countenance my Architectonical Labours, but out of his fuperabun-dant Goodnefs, did procure the Judgment and Approbation of our ableft Mathematicians. Dr. Hally, Dr. Arbuthnot, and feveral others, were unanimoufly of Opinion, that this Plan would be no Obstruction to the Navigation of the River, nor any Prejudice to the adjacent Property, which were the pretended Objections of fome who were no Well wifhers to the Bridge, for other Reafons. And to put this in a true Light, I fhall give the Dimensions of the old and new Bridge. The Extent of London-Bridge is 850 Feet, of which 450 Feet for the Water-courie above the Starlings in the 19 Arches, and 200 Feet Water-courie below the Starlings : The 18 Solids make 400 Feet. The new Bridge is 770 The solution make 400 rest. The free Moringe is 770 Feet long: The prefent Channel 257 feet, to be inlarged 43 Feet: The Water-couries by 7 Arches 650 Feet above the Starlings, and 608 Feet below them: The 6 Solids 120 Feet, from which fubtract 43 Feet added to the River, the Remainder that 43 refer added to the Kver, the Keinander is 77 Feet, being $4 \cdot o7$ 70 Feet. The Water-courfe in the old Bridge above the Starlings, is as 9 to 8 Feet, being 450 to 400 Feet Solid. The Water-courfe below the Starlings, as 4 to 13 Feet, being 200 to 650 Feet Solid i to that the greateft Water courfe in the old Bridge in the Breach in the Water-courfe in the old Bridge bis Feet, in the new 650 Feet. In the old Bridge below the Star-lings 200 Feet, in the new Bridge 608 Feet. In this new Plan I have made 5 Arches, each 100 Feet Diameter, and the Two extream Arches have 75 Feet, the Radius being ; of the fame, the Pires have 20 Feet, each being 2. The Breadth of this Bridge is 50 Feet, befides the Triangular But-ments. The Middle Caufe-way is 30 Feet broad, for Coaches and Carriages. Of each Side is a good For Coaches and Carriages. Of cach one see Pavement, raifed 1 Foot higher for Foot People, and 10 Feet broad, including the Parapet. Ornaments are ruftick and ftrong, with Two Tow-ers at each End. This Subject is intirely omitted by our Father Vitruvius : And Leon Baptift Albert is the First Architect to whom we are indebted for any Instruction, in the Eighth Book of his Ar-chitecture. In the Works of Antiquity, we find a great Diverfity in the Proportion of these Pires and Arches. In that at Rimini, by Augustus, the Arches are Semi circular 25 Feet Diameter, and the Pires 11 Feet : That at Vicenza, over the Bachiglione, has Three Arches, the Middle one is 30 Feet in Diameter, the Radius 4: The Side Arches are 22 Feet $\frac{1}{2}$, and the Pires are 5 Feet, be-ing $\frac{3}{2}$. That at Vicenza, over the Rorone, has allo Arches, the Middle is 29 Feet, and the Side Arches 25 Feet, and the Pires 5 Feet. In the Pons Senatorius at Rome, the Arches are Semi-circular, the Pires ;, without any Impost at springing the Arch. That of St. Angelo, formerly the Pons Ælim, the most magnificent in all Rome, whose very Ruins raife Veneration ; the Pire is ; of the Arch, which is Semi-circular. In that de Quatro Capi, anciently the Pons Tarpeius, the Pire is i of the Arch also Semi-circular. The last is a few

of this learned Gentleman, are, above all, to be re-corded. It was built, Anno 1724. A new Defign for a Bridge at Lambeth. p. 56. Lib. 3. Cap. 14. with Three Arches; that in the Middle has 60 Feet in Diameter, the Sides 48 Feer, their Rife is $\frac{1}{2}$: The Pires have 12 Feet, being $\frac{1}{2}$ of the great Arch. Upon this Proportion I have formed my Defign, and I think I can conclude with no greater Authority.

Wilton, p. 57, 58, 59, 60.

IN Wilifbire, the Seat of the Right Honourable I the Earl of Pembroke and Montgomery. I have made Two double Plates in Perspective, and having faid fo much in the Second Volume, with Refpect to the Building, I fhall add nothing here.

Apple Dorecombe, p. 61.

I N the Isle of Wight, in the County of Southampton, the Seat of Sir Robert Worfley, Baronet. I have made One Plate in Perspective of this House, which is adorned with a Corinthian Pillastrade; the Wings have Pedements, and the middle Part is finished with an Attick. The whole is cafed with finished with an Attick. The whole is ca Portland Stone, and was built, Anno 1710.

High Meadow, p. 62.

General Plan of Burlington Houfe and Offices in Pickadilly .


